we're all in that crowd.*

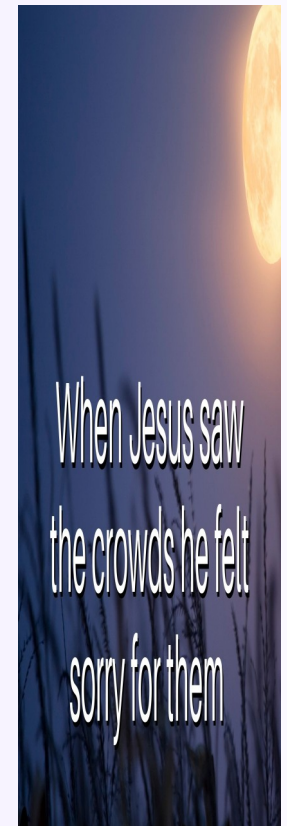
He had compassion on the crowd.
