2nd August, 2020 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The miracle of the feeding of the five thousand.

Speaking in 2014, Pope Francis saw three messages in our Gospel.

Compassion:-Jesus has gone to a lonely place, mourning the death of John the Baptist. When a large crowd comes in search of him, Jesus does not react with irritation, he reacts with compassion. This is not simply feeling pity; it means to suffer with, to empathize with the suffering of another. Jesus is like this: he suffers together with us. And the sign of this compassion in our Gospel is that Jesus took pity on the five thousand and healed their sick.

Sharing:-The disciples wanted to send the crowd away to buy some food. Jesus tells them "give them something to eat yourselves." He is telling us that we have a provident Father, and God who will provide. He gives us each day our daily bread. And is important to share what we have with those who are in need.

Eucharist:-We are told that Jesus "raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing, and breaking the loaves handed them to his disciples". This is also what Jesus did at the Last Supper, when he established the perpetual memorial of the Eucharist. But Jesus does not give us just any bread, it is the bread of eternal life, he gives himself, offering himself to the Father out of love for us.

At our Mass today, our priest will take, bless and break the Eucharist with us, just as Jesus did at the feeding of the five thousand, and as he did with his disciples at the Last Supper.

Let us pray that we receive that Eucharist with the sentiments of Jesus, which are compassion and the will to share.
