Feast of Christ the King.

The life that Jesus led while He was on earth, was not the life of a King. He did not have the Authority, the Power and the Wealth we associate with Kings. A good description of the life of Jesus, is outlined in a piece *One Solitary Life*.*

Here is a man who was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He grew up in another village. He worked in a carpenter shop until He was thirty. Then for three years he was an itinerant preacher.

He never owned a home. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family. He never went to college. He never put His foot inside a big city. He never travelled two hundred miles from the place He was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but Himself.

Yet Jesus has had an extraordinary impact on our world—an impact worthy of any King. *One Solitary life continues:*

“Nineteen long centuries have come and gone, and today Jesus is a centrepiece of the human race and leader of the column of progress. I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that were ever built; all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that every reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life”.

The message today is that we can live in the peace of Jesus Christ if we accept Him as our God and as our Saviour. But we must also allow him to rule our lives as our King and that is our prayer on this day.
