3rd Sunday in Lent

Places of worship were important to Jesus. Various synagogues and The Temple in Jerusalem are mentioned 120 times in the Gospels. In the Jewish tradition, God himself was present in the Holy of Holies area of The Jerusalem Temple which was a very special place for the Jews.

Each year the Holy Family went to The Temple to mark the feast of the Passover. When he was twelve Jesus went missing after one such pilgrimage. He was found three days later sitting in The Temple "among the teachers, listening to them..."- Jesus said to Mary "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"

Our Gospel today is set in the Temple during Passover time. A now thirty year old Jesus is upset by the way the Temple has become a "market place" - with animals and birds for sale. Jesus "drove them all out of The Temple." He broke with the Jewish traditions of animal sacrifice and introduced himself as the new sacrifice. "Destroy this sanctuary and in three days I will raise it up".

Our churches are where we the followers of Jesus gather to listen to the Gospels, the writings on which our faith is based – in the same way the young Jesus listened in The Temple. Our God is here too present in Holy Communion.

These Churches are special places. They were built with love and hard work through the generosity of previous generations. Let us pray for continued respect for them- they are important to us.
