Who rules your world?

Today is the Feast of Christ the King. It marks the end of the Church's year. It brings with it a very important message - The Kingship of Jesus Christ.

Our First reading highlights the awesome power of God. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. We are then reminded of the eternity of God. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroyed.

In our Gospel Jesus says Mine is not a kingdom of this world. The rules of this world do not apply to our powerful and eternal Jesus.

We however, can be swayed by the Kings of this world. That is why in 1925 Pope Pius introduced The Feast of Christ the King. He and other Church leaders wished to push back against dictators emerging throughout Europe.

These despots wished to crush all church influence in their countries. Other Christian Churches followed the lead of Pope Pius. Lutheran, Anglican, Moravian, Methodist, Reformed and United Protestant churches now celebrate the Feast of Christ the King.

These days we face a new, more subtle, dictatorship. The dictatorship of "might is right" or majority opinion. We are encouraged to set aside our convictions under the weight of the majority view on issues - particularly moral issues. Sometimes we are even asked to accept as indisputable, the view of majorities in other places. We frequently hear it said "what they do in the UK".

Jesus Christ is our King. Let us listen to Him.
