Our Gospel today contains messages which make us feel very uncomfortable. When Jesus is asked "will there only be a few saved?" His answer was "Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because I tell you many will try to enter and will not succeed." From this it appears that it will be very difficult to live the Christian message and enter in to heaven. Why is the Christian message so difficult to live by?

The Basic Christian message: - Matthew's Gospel.

'Come, you who are blessed by My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave Me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave Me something to drink, I was a stranger and you took Me in, I was naked and you clothed Me, I was sick and you looked after Me, I was in prison and you visited Me.'

Our World's attitude is very different- The words of Pope Francis Dublin 2019.

Today's world has little use for the weak, the vulnerable and all those it deems "unproductive". The world tells us to be strong and independent, with little care for those who are alone or sad, rejected or sick, not yet born or dying. The tumult of our times is really one of selfishness, of personal interests... The world needs a revolution of love.

To love is to be vulnerable.

"Love anything and your heart will be wrung and possibly broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact you must give it to no one, not even an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all entanglements. Lock it up safe in the casket or coffin of your selfishness. But in that casket, safe, dark, motionless, airless, it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable. To love is to be vulnerable." C.S. Lewis
