Jesus Walks on Water

On a human level the Gospel today tells the story of a man, Jesus, walking on water. He rescues his friend Peter who unsuccessfully tries to walk on water too. Peter starts to sink because as Jesus tells him, his Faith is weak 'Man of little faith', Jesus said 'why did you doubt?. Jesus then calms the Storm.

There is another level to the Gospel. Many equate the boat in the story, to the Church, and the disciples to the people of God.

Pope Benedict used the boat analogy for the Church many times. Speaking in 2017 he said ... the Lord does not abandon His church, even when the boat has taken on so much water as to be on the verge of capsizing.

The boat that is the Catholic Church, is in exceptional difficulty in these times. Pope Benedict was of the view that the weakness of human frailty is at the root of the problems.

"..... We have learned and experienced that original sin exists We have seen that human frailty is present in the Church, that the barque of the Church is even sailing against the wind in storms that threaten the ship, and at times we have thought: "the Lord is asleep and has forgotten us".

The concept of Original sin is not popular. The idea that new born babies come into the world with sin seems harsh. However the ideas of human frailty is obvious to us all. Do you know any completely perfect person? I don't. We all seem perfect in our imperfection. The Apostle Peter is a wonderful example of an imperfect person. He was impulsive. He was disloyal to Jesus. He had a temper.

Peter's faith in Jesus, like ours, was inconsistent. When Peter turned his eyes away from Jesus he became conscious of the terrible storm around him.

Prayer: We acknowledge our human frailty Lord. Save us from the storms we face and please guide your Church through these difficult times.
