Synod on Synodality update 13/10/2023.

This week delegates to the Synod elected seven members to a thirteen member Supervising Commission for the Synthesis Report . Pope Francis appointed three members and a further three members came from the Secretariat of the Synod. This Commission will supervise the drafting of a Synthesis Report of the confidential conversations and speeches at the October 2023 assembly.

Irish involvement

Sister Patricia Murray, who is executive secretary of the International Union of Superiors General, is a member of the Supervising Commission. Sr. Patricia (Loretto order) studied at UCD, Trinity College Dublin and Catholic Theological Union in Chicago and has a doctorate in ministry degree. Sr. Patricia was originally a secondary school teacher/principal .

The Synod report itself will be written by a 62 member, non voting expert Group. Father Eamonn Conway of the Archdiocese of Tuam is a member of this expert group. Fr. Conway is Head of Theology and Religious Studies at Mary Immaculate College, Limerick.

Representing the Irish Bishops' Conference at the Synod are Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ of Raphoe and Bishop Brendan Leahy of Limerick.

Reflecting on the Synod, Bishop Leahy said: The Church does not stand still. The Spirit pushes us forward. Pope Francis comments on the expression sometimes heard: "We have always done it that way". He calls this "poison for the life of the Church" and adds: "those who think this way, perhaps without even realising it, make the mistake of not taking seriously the times in which we are living. The danger, in the end, is to apply old solutions to new problems. A patch of rough cloth that ends up creating a worse tear (cf. Mt 9:16).

It is important that the synodal process be exactly this: a process of becoming, a process that involves the local Churches, in different phases and from the bottom up, in an exciting and engaging effort that can forge a style of communion and participation directed to mission".
