## **30th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

If you Google the term "Golden Rule of Life" the answer comes up "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." This advice has its origins in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

As a way to live a good life the "Golden Rule" is a wonderful philosophy. It brings out good qualities in people such as forgiveness, tolerance, patience, kindness, and generosity. These good qualities enrich a life.

However there can be an element of selfishness and pragmatism to following this Rule.

- If I treat people well then I am likely to be treated well by them in return.
- People who have little to give back to us, run the risk of being treated poorly.
- From a Christian point of view there is no religious aspect to "The Golden Rule" no connection with, or motivation from, a relationship with God.

#### **Revised Golden Rule**

The Gospel today provides a deeper and more difficult rule by which to live a good life and also provides us with the missing religious aspect to "The Golden Rule".

In the Gospel Jesus creates a clear link between our Faith - our relationship with God - and the lives we lead. Jesus tells us -'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself.

Love is the measure of faith, and faith is the soul of love. We can no longer separate a religious life, a pious life, from service to brothers and sisters, to the real brothers and sisters that we encounter.
