32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Under Jewish custom at the time of Jesus, one year before any couple were formally married, a marriage covenant was first agreed between the Father of the Bride and the groom. The couple were betrothed for this year.

On the wedding day itself, the groom and his supporters processed by torch light to the bride's home to accompany the bride and her party to the groom's father's house, where the formal wedding ceremony took place. The groom's arrival to meet his bride was a major part of the marriage process.

Our Gospel parable today is set during the arrival of a groom. Five "foolish" bridesmaids awaited him but were unprepared. In a panic they had to urgently source oil for their lamps. The five fully prepared "sensible" bridesmaids got to the wedding, the foolish ones missed out.

In the parable the bridesmaids had one important task to undertake and they failed to complete it. The same is true for us. God has a special task for each one of us. John Henry Newman wrote about this :-

"God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons.

He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it if I do but keep His commandments.

Therefore, I will trust Him, whatever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him, in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him. If I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. He does nothing in vain. He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends. He may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide my future from me. Still, He knows what He is about."
