'Let us Dream' Pope Francis

During the Covid Pandemic, Pope Francis gave a number of interviews which he later put into book-form with Austen Ivereigh. Over the next few weeks we will print excepts from the book 'Let us Dream'.

Coronavirus has accelerated a change of era that was already under way. By "change of era" I mean not just that this is a time of change, but the categories and assumptions that we used before to navigate our world are no longer effective. Things we never imagined would take place - the environmental collapse, a global pandemic, the return of populisms - we are now living through, and what we once considered normal will increasingly no longer be. It is an illusion to think that we can go back to where we were. Attempts at restoration always take us down a dead-end street.

Faced with this uncertainty, ideology and the rigid mindset have an allure that we must resist. Fundamentalism is a means of assembling thought and behaviour as a refuge that supposedly protects a person from a crisis. Fundamentalist mindsets offer to shelter people from destabilizing situations in exchange for a kind of existential quietism. They offer you an attitude and a single, closed way of thinking, as a substitute for the kind of thinking that open you to truth. Whoever takes refuge in fundamentalism is afraid of setting out on the road to truth. He already "has" the truth, and deploys it as a defense, so that any questioning of it is interpreted as an aggression against his person.
