Officially Holy Week is the great week in the Church's year, a week in which Christians throughout the world recall and celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The reality however, is that Holy Week goes unnoticed by some and has little or no impact on many. We may need to step back, to stop and reflect on what it means to be a Christian and who Christ is for us, and how we will celebrate that in this Holy Week.

Today, Palm Sunday, we recall Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem knowing that he was later to suffer and die. Later in the week we enter into the Easter Triduum.

On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper when we commemorate the institution of the Eucharist and Christ's call to serve. Good Friday brings us in touch with the suffering of Christ and indeed the sufferings of many throughout the world. Finally in the liturgy of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night we celebrate with joy the resurrection of Jesus Christ, his victory over sin and death.

While there is no obligation on us to take part in any or all of the liturgies of Holy Week we should be drawn to celebrate the events that give meaning to our faith and to what we profess as Christians.

There was a time in the early Church when it was unthinkable for a Christian not to celebrate the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. In fact one could almost identify a Christian by his or her attendance at the great annual Christian victory celebration – Christ's victory and the Christian victory over sin and death.

Perhaps all of us might take some time out to consider how we will celebrate Holy Week this year. We might consider participating in the three liturgies in a way we haven't done so before and make it a time of renewal of our faith, a dying and rising to new life with Christ.
