#### Judges

The highest paid sports pundits, TV stars and journalists are those who pass judgement on sportsmen, entertainers and public figures. We love being "judges" ourselves by voting for our preferences on singers, dancers or reality show contestants.

Our Gospel today has two important messages. The first message reveals God's attitude towards those who act as "judges" of others. The second message is the very different way God will be a judge of us.

#### Let's hear what the Judges have to say

The Scribes and the Pharisees bring a woman to Jesus who had been caught committing adultery. The judges have a question for Jesus:-Moses has ordered us to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?

Jesus tells the men "if there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." The Scribes and The Pharisees went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman.

When Jesus reminded the Scribes and Pharisees of their own failings, they retreated. We too should not rush to judgement without remembering our own faults and failings.

#### Mercy not condemnation

When Jesus and the woman are left alone, he asks "has no one condemned you? 'no one sir' she replied. Jesus says 'neither do I condemn you.'

Jesus is merciful towards the poor woman. Mercy is showing compassion towards someone who does not deserve it. Mercy is also an important part of our faith and we seek it at every mass we attend. May God Almighty have mercy on us.

## Repentance

God will always show mercy to us, but we must be repentant - be sorry. The best way to show repentance is to change our lives and not repeat our mistakes and sins.

That is what Jesus tells us and tells the woman in our Gospel. 'Go away, and do not sin anymore.'

The greatest of all faults is to be conscious of none.

Of all the actions of man, repentance is the most divine (Robert Carlyle).
