PEACE

"My peace I give to you."

The word for peace in our Gospel today is 'Shalom', a Hebrew word used to say hello and goodbye in ordinary usage. Yet, it also carries a much deeper meaning. 'Shalom' signifies the peace that people long for, that peace that brings wholeness, completeness and fulfilment. Jesus tells us that this 'shalom' is a peace that the world does not give. It comes through cultivating a deep awareness of the Divine Spirit within our hearts, 'our home'. This is the true peace we long for, but there are many obstacles and distractions in our way.

For example, one of the causes of the ecological crisis our world is currently facing is over-consumption. In Laudato Si', the encyclical of Pope Francis on the environment, he notes that the roots of this crisis are deeply spiritual. We are constantly trying to bring fulfilment to our lives by having the next upgrade, the next new gadget. This over-consumption is driven by the market, but it only succeeds because we are not at peace with ourselves. Goods are marketed to fill a gap, which they never can fill. At its heart, unbridled consumption is driven by a lack of peace.

In contrast, the peace that Christ offers is freely given, waiting for your acceptance. It comes from a loving interior relationship with God, which brings with it wholeness and a loving peace.
