Third Sunday in Ordinary time - The start of the ministry of Jesus.

The first reading is from the prophet Isaiah. An extract from this reading also appears in the Gospel of Matthew.

The details of the First reading

Naphtali and Zebulun were two border areas in the far north of Israel. In 700 BC the Assyrians invaded Northern Israel and took most of the population into captivity as slaves. These slaves are the Lost tribes of Israel. This event was a humiliation for the Israelites. The prophet Isaiah says :- “In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali.” Then Isaiah consoles his people. Someone great is coming and “in days to come he will confer glory.” The humiliated people “that lived in darkness” will see “a great light.”

The Gospel

Jesus Christ grew up in, and started his ministry around, the districts of Naphtali and Zebulun. In the Gospel Matthew points out this fact. He quotes the prophet Isaiah’s words from the first reading and then declares :- In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: Jesus is the Messiah - the chosen one.

Message for us

In these times, when religion and Faith are marginalised by modern wisdom, we believers should remember that the God we worship was first venerated four thousand years ago. Modern wisdom may not endure as well.

Start of Ministry

Now Jesus must take on his own mission. Upon “Hearing that John had been arrested” Jesus set out on his ministry in the world. One most important step was the gathering together of his apostles. This gathering is the beginning of Christianity.

Pope Francis commented on this Gospel in 2017:- We, today’s Christians, have the joy of proclaiming and witnessing to our faith because there were those humble and courageous men who responded generously to Jesus’ call.

Let us pray that we can be humble and courageous people who respond to the call of Jesus and carry on the 4,000 year old worship of our God.
